

EVERY FARMER WILL GET COMPENSATION: OFFICIALS

- Officials have taken up sanitation works at water-logged areas to prevent the spread of diseases
- Rs 2,500 will be provided to families taking shelter at the relief centres

THE Prakasam district collector, AS Dinesh Kumar announced that the government will compensate every farmer who lost their crop to Cyclone Michaung.

The special officer to the Prakasam district, PS Pradyumna, district collector AS Dinesh Kumar, SP Malika Garg, joint collector K Srinivasulu, Additional SP Nageswara Rao participated in the video conference with chief minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, and explained about the loss, and relief activities taken up by the administration.

Collector reviewed the condition with the district-level officials and said that the crop loss in 15, 000 hectares, and a detailed re-

port on the status and loss of crops will be submitted to the government after a detailed survey is done.

He said that following the assurance of the chief minister, action will be taken to provide insurance, input subsidy or seeds on

subsidy to the affected farmers based on their crop status.

The electricity supply in 236 villages was disrupted due to the cyclone, but the ground-level staff quickly responded and restarted the supply to the villages.

Collector said that they have taken up sanitation works at water-logged areas to prevent the spread of diseases and informed that Rs 2,500 will be provided to families taking shelter at the relief centres.

Later, collector in-

spected damaged crops at Naguluppalapadu and interacted with the chilli, tobacco, jowar, and black gram farmers. Farmers explained that crops could not survive as water could not be emptied from the field.

DISTRICT collector Prasanna Venkatesh held a teleconference with RDOs, tahsildars, MPDOs, officials of agriculture and other departments here on Wednesday.

Speaking on the occasion, collector instructed officials to focus on draining rainwater from fields. Many fields in the district were inundated by heavy rain triggered by Cyclone Michaung which crossed the coast on Tuesday.

Collector asked officials to create confidence among farmers that the government is behind them to support in the hour of crisis. Officials should assure farmers that their crops will be protected besides extending compensation to the crop loss and

purchasing the wet crop.

The cyclone and rain withered crops in an extent of 33,724 acres, whereas crop in 24,575 acres was inundated by rainwater.

As part of paddy procurement, so far 1.06 lakh metric tonnes of grains were purchased.

In off-line, 28,324 metric tonnes of paddy were procured. Officials have been directed to dry the paddy before shifting to rice mills.

Collector instructed officials to avail the services of

11 dryer mills located in Kalkaluru in the paddy procurement and officials should ensure that no farmers lose the next crop.

Electricity was restored to 79 villages out of 80 villages faced disruption because of the cyclone. They have replaced 127 electric poles with new ones.

For taking up special sanitation programmes, 547 teams deputed. As many as 6,000 people were extended medical services by conducting 78 medical camps.

Officials told to start enumeration of damage crop

NTR district collector S Dilli Rao along with officials of revenue, agriculture, horticulture and other departments visited the cyclone-hit villages in Vijayawada rural mandal on Wednesday.

Collector instructed officials to take up the enumeration on crop damage suffered

by farmers due to Cyclone Michaung, which crossed the coast causing inundation of farm lands in some parts of the district.

Collector visited Pydurupadu and Rayanapadu in Vijayawada rural mandal and examined farm lands which were inundated due to the rains and spoke to the farmers.

He also enquired about the steps taken by the district ad-

ministration to drain out the storm water stagnated in the agriculture farm lands. Farmers informed that if the rainwater is not drained out, the crops will be damaged in one week.

Collector has assured farmers that JCBs will be sent to their villages and steps will be taken to drain out the rainwater. He said paddy was cultivated in 41,163 hectares and

harvesting was completed in over 10,000 hectares.

The farmers said crop damage was caused due to overflowing of drains and stagnation of rainwater in the farm lands. They expressed concern that 75 percent paddy crop will be damaged, if the rainwater is not drained out immediately.

District agriculture officer S Nagamanemma, Assistant Director B Venkateswara Rao and mandal level officers accompanied collector.

Officials told to drain out rainwater from fields

DISTRICT collector M Venugopal Reddy directed the officials to drain out rainwater from the agriculture fields to reduce losses caused by crop damage. He along with Guntur Municipal Corporation commissioner Kirthi Chekuri conducted a video conference with the mandal level officials on Wednesday.

Speaking on the occasion, he directed the officials to distribute 25 kgs rice, 1 litre oil packet, 1 kg Bengal gram, and 1 kg potatoes to cyclone hit families. Following orders of the Chief Minister Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy, they should distribute financial assistance of Rs 2500 per family or Rs 1000 to each person. He assured that the government will pay damages to the houses affected by the cyclone, as soon as a report is submitted. He directed the officials to take steps to drain out the rainwater from the agriculture fields and suggested using the services of MGNREGA beneficiaries. He stressed the coordination among the officials to drain out the rainwater from the agriculture fields. He directed the officials to submit a report on the crop damage by Thursday. He instructed the officials to be alert till the normalcy is restored.

District revenue officer K Chandrasekhara Rao and district agriculture officer N Venkateswarulu were present.

Power restoration works underway in state

Energy department says special CS Vijayanand is monitoring the works continuously

THE power restoration works in the cyclone-affected areas are continuing in full swing in the state after the cyclone Michaung crossed the coast near Bapatla on Tuesday afternoon. The cyclone coupled with winds at a speed of 90-100 km damaged power lines, poles, feeders, sub-stations in many parts of the state interrupting power supply and causing loss to the energy department.

In a press release on Wednesday the energy department said that power restoration works are underway and special chief secretary, energy, K Vijayanand was monitoring the works continuously and instructed the officials to complete the works in a time bound manner.

APTransco and discoms' officials appraised the status of power restoration works to the special chief secretary Vijayanand.

APTransco officials explained that of the 17 feeders that were affected, 10 feeders have already been restored and the remaining 7 are expected to be restored by Thursday.
